



FREE ETHANOL WARRANTY

Use Opti-Mizer MAX continuously in your new 4-cycle engine and Interlube will reimburse the repair cost of any engine/carburetor damage caused by Ethanol Fuel (E10) for up to 6 years.

TO QUALIFY:

- Purchase a 6-pack of pouches, or one 16oz. bottle, of Opti-Mizer MAX along with your new 4-cycle equipment. Opti-Mizer MAX must be purchased at the same time and location as the new equipment.
- Use Opti-Mizer MAX continuously throughout engine operation. <u>All</u> fuel run through engine must be mixed with Opti-Mizer MAX.
- Always store equipment with Opti-Mizer MAX mixed fuel in tank.
- Save all Opti-Mizer MAX receipts for proof and timing of purchases. This includes the original purchase receipt for both the equipment and Opti-Mizer MAX.

TO FILE A CLAIM:

- Return to original dealer to have engine diagnosed and repaired.
- The cause of damage must be confirmed (by the dealer) on the repair bill as having resulted from ethanol fuel use.
- Equipment owner sends the repair bill and all Opti-Mizer MAX proof of purchase receipts to Interlube for repair reimbursement. Must be original receipts...no photocopies.
- Interlube will verify the claim and send a check back to the equipment owner within 45 days of submission.

REPAIR REIMBURSEMENT:

 Flat rate = \$60 plus accumulated value of all Opti-Mizer MAX purchases up to the full cost of repair (taxes excluded). Example: customer purchases a bottle of Opti-Mizer MAX with their new equipment and another one sometime later. Their reimbursement for repair would be up to \$60 plus 2x \$17.95 = \$95.90.

EXCLUSIONS:

- Only available on power equipment engines up to 31hp and coverage ends once the equipment age exceeds 6 years.
- Warranty coverage not available on motorcycle, marine or automotive engines.
- Standard seasonal service is not a warrantable repair. Examples: tune-ups, carburetor flush, spark plug & filter replacement, etc. These routine maintenance activities should be performed as recommended by the engine/equipment manufacturer.
- Damage caused by negligence of the equipment owner or operator. I.e.: leaving equipment exposed to rain or snow, abuse and/or misuse of equipment, flood damage, etc.
- All engine problems during the original manufacturer's warranty period must first be considered for coverage under the engine or equipment manufacturer's warranty. Only damage <u>not</u> covered by the original warranty should be considered for coverage under the Opti-Mizer MAX Ethanol Warranty.

IMPORTANT:

Running rough is not a warrantable condition. Often an engine will run a little rough
after being stored. This condition will improve on its own once fresh fuel with Opti-Mizer
MAX has a chance to flow through. An engine must be inoperable before considering
ethanol warranty coverage. "Inoperable" is defined as, will not start or will not keep
running.
